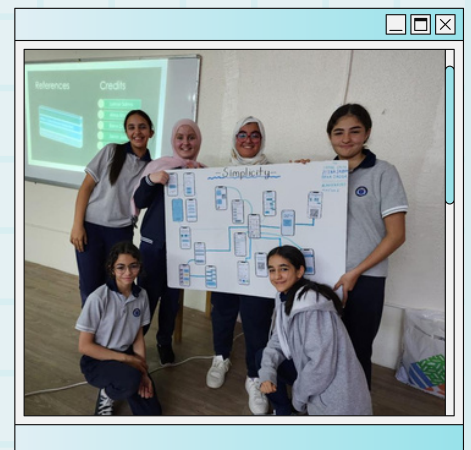
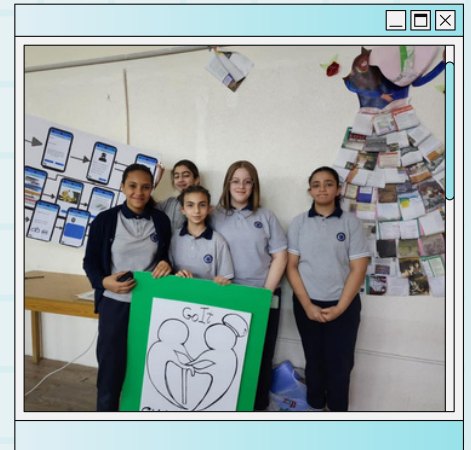


## Video Viewer

## Artificial Intelligence: The Undiscovered Ocean of Truth

In modern times, it is no secret that Artificial Intelligence (AI), the emulation of human intellectual processes by machines, particularly computer systems, is ubiquitous; mankind is simply reluctant of recognizing just how extensively they cling to it. Nonetheless, the morality of expanding upon AI systems presently remains subject to debate, though as necessary as it is to take into account the risks associated with its utilization, one must comprehend that high achievements in science and humanitarianism are made possible with the assistance of AI, and while some may claim that these sorts of developments might lead to power abuse, one must acknowledge that such occurrences are highly unlikely provided limits are established, given that, in the end, AI redefined is merely a tool, not a threat, or yet just another outcome associated with the reification notion, whereby humanity concretizes the abstract concept of AI through the use of computer engineering.

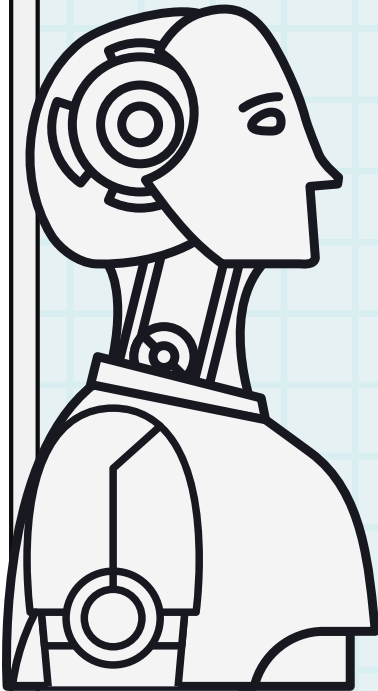
With scientific fields evolving at a rapid pace, the digital assistance offered by Artificial Intelligence has become crucial, providing improved risk-taking capabilities in addition to increasingly accurate hypotheses, an evident benefit of AI employment. Additionally, although some may claim that relying exclusively on AI could possibly lead to blunders, it is nevertheless essential to bear in mind that humans are also vulnerable to biases and emotions, which can impede judgment and decision-making. Collaboration between human expertise and AI skills, on the contrary, is never an adverse thought for it generates higher-quality outcomes in a variety of settings. An example of an effective AI contribution to research is an experiment undertaken by researcher Tim Landgraf of Freie Universität Berlin by which scientists obtained the competence to communicate with honeybees via the application of AI. What's essential as honeybees "speak" are their bodily movements and noises, which were followed by computers, specifically deep-learning algorithms with computer vision integrated with natural-language processing. Scientists have developed these algorithms and learned what each signal means, marking a tremendous breakthrough as it paves the way for human-animal interaction to finally be made possible and further showcases AI potential.

Jeff Bezos, executive chairman of Amazon, once stated, "What I predict is that jobs will get more engaging. Because you have to remember, a lot of the jobs today are quite routine." An additional benefit of AI utilization is that it can automate repetitive and monotonous activities, allowing humans to concentrate on higher-level and inventive tasks. For instance, several positions in numerous sectors that need little to no decision-making, such as customer service inquiries or data input, could all be readily automated by the mere deployment of AI-powered solutions. And despite that a number may argue that advances in AI will lead to mass unemployment, several experts contend that the workforce will grow more specialized; roles that call for an increased degree of work automation cannot be fulfilled, such as innovation, problem-solving, and qualitative skills. According to a 2021 survey, 61% of workers believe that the implementation of AI within the workplace has culminated in enhanced productivity.

One well-known argument against AI is that its triumph may spell the end of humanity. Nearly any technology has the potential to trigger damage under improper hands; innumerable science fiction novels have warned of robots or robot-human cyborgs running amok— R.U.R. (1921) by Karel Capek and Frankenstein (1818) by Mary Shelley serve as two early examples. However, the success of AI relies primarily on the manner mankind establishes to implement and innovate with this technology; it's solely up to humanity to both harness its potential for the greater good and mitigate its potential hazards. And while it certainly is true that there are valid concerns regarding the possible threats of AI, it remains pertinent not to overlook the fact that AI's progression is an immense asset to the human race in various capacities. As an illustration, consider AI's valuable impact on combating climate change. Researchers have been leveraging AI to envision the consequences of future floods and wildfires, assist climate decision-making, monitor the status of forests, and exchange data. A further instance demonstrates how scholars are working on a system that relies on drone footage and machine learning to detect unexploded weapons from underground landmines, which murder thousands of innocent individuals yearly. Such amenities remain inaccessible without artificial intelligence's electronic assistance.

At last, it is vital to reflect on the positive and negative aspects of adopting machine learning, however, one ought to remain aware that for as long as AI continues to be under human supervision, the likelihood of AI "dominating the human race" is exceptionally remote. Moreover, as previously noted, AI acts as a tool, a tool that might provide a panacea for all complications and may perhaps even be a portal to a modern unbiased world. Newton once said that he felt like a boy playing on the shoreline, picking up a pebble here and a shell there while the great ocean of truth lay undiscovered before him. Three hundred years later, an amazing collection of pebbles and shells has been gathered, but the great undiscovered ocean still stretches into the distance, sparkling with promise. The boat -- Machine learning-- is the gift, and it's time to set sail.

### Unlocking Pandora's Box Once More

"The development of full artificial intelligence could spell the end of the human race.... It would take off on its own and redesign itself at an ever-increasing rate. Humans, who are limited by slow biological evolution, could not compete and would be superseded." Hawking explained to the BBC. The unintended effects of humans' actions and innovations have been well-documented in history. As an illustration, consider the industrial revolution. The first factories that were built contributed to an increase in economic development, worker wages, and the states of nations. Naturally, one must return something after receiving something. What gifts have people given to the Earth? Pollution in all its manifestations and global warming. If these were the sole effects of industries, what would a machine with unquestionably more intellect than humans cause?

Selfishness is predominantly foreseeable from mankind. Why bother worrying about others when they remain clear of the upshots of their actions? A 2020 report from the World Economic Forum estimated that, by 2025, 97 million new jobs would be created due to AI, losing 85 million to the machines in return. However, not all people may have the qualifications required for such employment. What would be left for the less fortunate if AI eliminated essential low-wage jobs such as housekeeping and nearly all employment in food services? Furthermore, according to PwC, more than 40% of workers with a low level of education will be displaced by 2030, compared to

the 10% with a high degree of education. AI could even displace workers in such professions that require PhD degrees and other post-college expertise. In the conflict between jobs done by humans and automation, some professions might as well go extinct.

Artificial intelligence (AI) is developed by humans who are, by nature, prejudiced. As a result, it is incapable of understanding ethical and moral issues, since it is programmed only with an objective, not with a sense of right and wrong. Due to its inability to understand the ethical implications of its actions, AI may cause harm or injustice. Furthermore, because AI has only one goal and no moral or ethical code, it can be employed in unethical or immoral ways, emphasizing why it cannot be trusted to make ethical or moral decisions when interacting with humans. This can help explain why speech-recognition AI often fails to understand certain dialects and accents. Gender prejudice is also an issue in this case. Searching the term "school girl" on the Internet will almost certainly provide photographs of women and girls dressed in sexualized costumes. However, if you type "school boy," the results will largely consist of average young school boys.

Developing trust and establishing a human-to-human connection are necessary to engage people in conversations about themselves. Unlike machines, humans are capable of communicating feelings, expressing emotions, and reading people instantly. In contrast, machines cannot develop empathy or profoundly comprehend human experience. The likelihood of people ever forming a deep emotional bond with machines is highly unlikely regardless of how skillfully they are engineered to react to people and emotions. They lack intuition, empathy, and cultural sensitivity. The ability to use these skills is precisely what confers power to humans. Humans are the only beings capable of reading a person's expressions and knowing exactly what to say. Therefore, AI

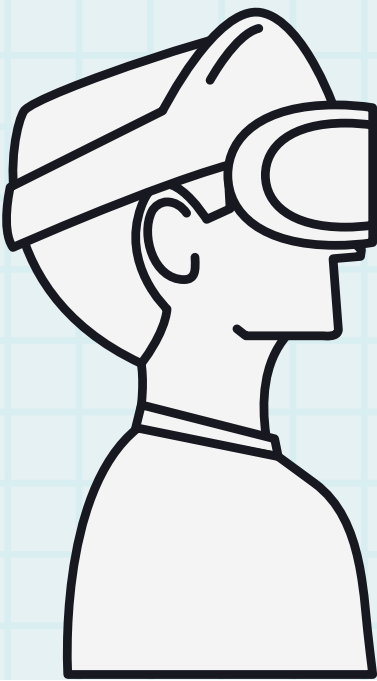
cannot replace human beings. Workplace soft skills are also crucial for every employee. Communicating clearly, working in teams, paying attention to details, and using critical and creative thinking are all among these skills. These abilities, however, require a higher level of emotional intelligence and cognition, which AI cannot develop.

As it becomes increasingly prominent in our daily lives, Artificial Intelligence poses both potentials and hazards. While AI has the potential to deliver enormous benefits in fields such as medical, transportation, and manufacturing, it also poses ethical questions regarding privacy and justice. Furthermore, AI systems are subject to malicious attacks that could have serious consequences in the real world. As a result, it is becoming increasingly vital to assess the dangers and advantages of AI use and design rules that balance these variables in order for all members of society to benefit from the potential that AI provides in a safe and responsible manner. As expected, however, the hazards of using AI outweigh its benefits.
