Heart Awareness Day




PSU Math Competition



The science fair at our school is a highly anticipated event that showcases the creativity and innovation of our students.






The Powerful Mouse

أجريت لفاءً مع الشاعر الجاهلي لبيد بن ربيعة وقمت بطرح بعض الاسئلة حول حياته:

سؤال: ما هي أصولك ومكان ولادتك؟ جواب: أنا لبيد بن ربيعة بن حارث بن عبد العزى، ولدت في المدينة المنورة .

سؤال: ما هي المراحل الرئيسية في حياتك؟ جواب: عشت حياة مليئة بالتجارب والمغامرات. بدأت حياتي كشاعر بدوي يعيش في الصحراء، ثم تحركت إلى مكة والمدينة والكوفة، حيث تعرفت على شعراء أخرين وتفاعلت معهم. لاحقاً، تحولت إلى العاصمة الأموية دمشق حيث استُقبلت بتقدير كبير وأصبحت جزءًا من الحياة الثقافية والأدبية هناك.

سوال: هل كان لديك عائلة وابناء؟ جواب: نعم، كنت متزوجًا ولدي أبناء. كان لدي عائلة أعيش معها في مختلف المدن التي زرتها. كانت عائلتي دعمًا قويًا. لي

سؤال: كيف تعاملت مع التحولات السياسية والاجتماعية في عصرك؟

جواب: كشاعر، كنت اعيش في عصر مليء بالتحولات السياسية والاجتماعية. تعايشت معها وناقشتها في قصائدي. كنت أحاول أن أنقل الأفكار والشعور للناس في ذلك الوقت من خلال شعري.

ثم طرحت على الشباعر القدير أسئله تتعلق بشبعره وكان الحوار ممتع للغاية:

سؤال: ما هو الغرض الرئيس الذي تتناوله فصائدك؟ جواب: تتميز قصائدي بتناولها لمواضيع متنوعة، ولكن الغرض في الأغلب كان عن الحكمة. أتناول قضايا الحياة والموت، الحب والفراق، الزمان والمكان، وأعبر عن الحكم والمواعظ بأسلوب شعري راق ومعبر.

سؤال: ما هو الأسلوب الشعري الميز الذي تتبعه؟ جواب: استخدم اسلوب شعري فصيح وجميل، حيث استخدم البلاغة والتشبيه والمجاز في قصائدي. أنا من أوائل الشعراء الذين استخدموا القصيدة الكاملة بشكل متقن، وأتميز بتوزيع متقن للوزن والقافية في الأبيات.

سؤال: ما هي آبرز قصائدك؟ جواب: من أبرز قصائدي "المعلقة"، وهي واحدة من المعلقات السبع التي تُعتبر أعظم قصائد العصر الجاهلي. تتناول القصيدة قضايا الحياة والموت، وأعبر عن الحكمة باسلوب شعري مميز.

سؤال: ما هو الإرث الأدبي الذي تركته؟ جواب: أُعتبر واحداً من أعمدة الشعر الجاهلي وأحد أبرز شعراءه. قصائدي و إسهاماتي الشعرية تعتبر جزءًا هامًا من التراث الأدبي العربي. أثرت قصائدي في الأجيال اللاحقة من الشعراء والهمتهم في إبداعهم. وفي الختام، أود أن اشكر ضيفي الشاعر/ لبيد بن ربيعة على









Highlighted Senior Jacket Patches
